 - If management of wound is within the scope of competence of the attending service, dressings as per [NHS Tayside Wound Management Formulary](#) recommendations wherever possible.
 - Referral to community wound clinic services for complex or chronic wound management; Podiatry Services or Leg Ulcer Specialist clinic, contact in the first instance should be made with the Care and Treatment services in your area as detailed on page 2.
